The Potential Threat from Internal IEDs

Abstract

The topic of this one-hour presentation is the potential threat to aviation from a new source. The presentation looks at the nature of the threat, and discusses remediation options. The types of devices to be discussed also have Close Personal Protection implications. Attendance is limited to currently serving security professionals. The classification is **Law Enforcement Sensitive**.



Presenter: Mr Clive Williams, MG (Macquarie University, New South Wales)

Clive Williams is a former Army and Defence intelligence officer. He left Defence in 2002 and since then has been a Visiting Fellow at the Strategic and Defence Studies Centre at the Australian National University and an Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Policing Intelligence and Counter Terrorism at Macquarie University. He has also been a Visiting Professor at the Australian Defence Force Academy.

His main activity is running Masters course electives in terrorism, but he also runs Masters course electives covering counterterrorism and national security issues. Since 2002 he has worked in 16 countries, including Afghanistan, and is a regular presenter at international conferences.
